The Arctic, in broad daylight

The volcanic landscapes of Iceland or the frozen fjords of Spitsbergen, the blue icebergs of Disko Bay or the imposing reliefs of the Northwest Passage... Experiencing the Arctic summer also means being moved by encounters with the Inuit peoples and observing the boreal wildlife in the magic of a day without end.

THROUGH THE EYES OF

Claude-Olivier Marti



After his unforgettable discovery of the White Continent, loyal guest Claude-Olivier Marti then set sail for the Arctic. He shares his impressions and photographs from exploring Svalbard.

“May 2022. At last, the chance to discover Svalbard, this far-flung northern land, aboard *Le Boréal*. After leaving Longyearbyen, we head north towards Ny-Ålesund. This was Roald Amundsen’s starting point in 1926, when he became the first person to definitively reach the geographic North Pole. Our objective is different, but just as exciting: Kongsbreen (‘King’s Glacier’), one of the largest in Svalbard.

“The sky is overcast and the clouds low, heightening the dramatic contrasts of the landscape. Once the zodiacs are in the water, we set off for an hour’s navigation through the ice, face to face with this monumental glacier. The colours are incredible: the water, stirred by our passage, turns almost red from the iron-rich sediments, while the ice itself shimmers in immaculate white and deep blue hues. The spectacle is breathtaking.



Nordautlandet Island and the Etonbreen glacier

“80°7'16" N: we reach the most northerly point of our route, near Moffen Island and its walrus colony. The North Pole is just 1,100 km away, intensifying the sense of adventure. We then continue our journey to the island of Nordautlandet, in the north-east of Svalbard. At around 6am, the captain makes an announcement: a female polar bear and her two cubs have been spotted. Watching these cubs – as cuddly as soft toys, yet destined to become formidable predators – is a striking and fascinating vision of the wild Arctic.



The polar ice cap

“Taking advantage of our position in the north-east of Svalbard, we head towards the majestic Austfonna ice cap. Its area of 8,500 km² makes it the largest in Europe. On deck, all the guests stand in silence, spellbound by the immensity of the ice.

Up close to the Samarinbreen glacier

“In southern Svalbard, our final stop in Hornsund Fjord brings us close to Samarinbreen Glacier, while carefully keeping a safe distance. Suddenly, there's a sharp crack and a wall of ice breaks away and collapses with a thunderous crash. This is to be our last trip before returning to Longyearbyen.”
